# Raven Purchase Successfully Funded

Denman Conservancy Association (DCA) has confirmed its agreement to purchase two adjacent lots totalling 32.02 hectares (~80 acres) from Raven Forest Products Ltd. 'Subject to' conditions were removed on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

The "Pickles Waterfall Wetland" properties are contiguous with Denman Island Provincial Park land at the Pickles Bridge and are across Pickles Road from the Inner Island Nature Reserve. The land also has a common boundary with DCA's Settlement Lands. These lands are home to the SARA listed Red-legged frog (Rana aurora) and contain habitat for many other species at risk.

This project was made possible by the Government of Canada through the Natural Heritage Conservation Program, part of Canada's Nature Fund, and the Provincial Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation's Acquisition Grant, as well as DCA's Acquisition Fund, a grant from Islands Trust Conservancy's Opportunity Fund, in-kind support from Nature Conservancy of Canada and funds generously provided by DCA members and supporters including Denman Island Chocolate and the Denman Climate Action Network. The purchase will be completed by September 30th.

The Douglas fir forest on the land is about 40 years old and has grown in very well. There are two significant wetland areas, the larger of which is a sedge fen draining via a seasonal stream which flows down a cascade into Pickles marsh, which is part of the headwaters of Beadnell Creek.

DCA looks forward to creating a Management Plan for the lands and providing public trails for the Denman community to explore.
